



Changes to Conargo & Pretty Pine waste

Conargo and Pretty Pine residents are invited to public meetings next Wednesday to discuss the planned conversion of local landfills to waste transfer stations.

There are five (5) rural waste disposal facilities within Edward River Council. The Pretty Pine facility has already reached capacity and the Conargo facility is nearing capacity.

“Currently rubbish received at these facilities is buried within un-lined trenches at all of these facilities. Edward River Council’s Waste Management Strategy, adopted by the Council at its meeting in September 2019, advocates that residual rubbish should be transferred to a licensed facility,” Council’s general manager Phil Stone said.

The planned changes at Conargo and Pretty Pine are in line with that strategy and will ensure these facilities are compliant with relevant legislation into the future.

Edward River Council received a \$200,000 grant from the NSW Government’s Environmental Trust as part of the NSW Environment Protection Authority’s Waste Less, Recycle More initiative, funded from the waste levy. Council also plans to contribute funds to converting the Conargo and Pretty Pine landfills into transfer stations.

“We are inviting members of the public to view the plans for how the transfer stations will be configured. These changes include the facilities being open and attended at specific times on regular days of the week, similar to what occurs at Blighty,” Mr. Stone said.

Blighty is open from 1.00 p.m. to 5.00p.m. on Thursdays and Sundays excluding public holidays, and Council is looking to provide similar levels of service at Conargo and Pretty Pine once converted.

“The detailed design work for improving the separation of recyclables from the

waste stream, culminating in the provision of skip bins also for unrecyclable waste is well underway,” he said.

Meetings with interested community members to outline the planned conversions and to receive feedback are planned to be held on Wednesday 17 February 2021 – at Conargo Hall at 9.00 a.m., and Pretty Pine Hall at 11.30 a.m.
